## SPOTLIGHT ON ROBIN RANDOLPH

(aka the Frybread Queen)

Music has always been a vital part of my life, and a continual source of joy and creativity for me. Although my parents were not themselves musicians, they had a true appreciation of music of all types. Our record player was well employed, filling our home with classical, opera, folk, big band, and popular music of the day. As soon as I was able to read, I began taking piano lessons, and continued through high school. During that time, I also picked up clarinet and guitar and began singing. As a young adult, I decided it wasn't too late to learn flute. I have played flute in the Southwest Civic Winds since 2012. I consider myself a dabbler, but my music gives me incredi-
 ble enjoyment, and THAT is why I stay involved with it.

When I was in my twenties, for a time I was in charge of children's music at my church. I taught children ages 3 to 12 different songs for a yearly performance, and for fun. I don't recall too many of the kids, but I do remember one little girl who always sat in the front row at the edge of her seat, smiling and SO eager to learn. She was a standout even then! That little 7-year-old was Amelia (Amy) Burns.

Fast forward about 12 years, and she became the director of the Durango Barbershoppers, with whom my husband has sung for 35 years. As a Barbershopper's wife, I had the opportunity over the next years to get reacquainted with Amy Burns, now Amy Barrett. In 2011 I received a phone call from Amy asking if I would like to be her administrative assistant for the Durango Children's Chorale. I readily agreed, and for the past 10 years I have enjoyed working alongside Amy, working with the kids, being a liaison with the parents, and even tending a Barrett baby or three during rehearsals. In 2014 Amy started the Durango Youth Chorus to provide a greater singing opportunity for middle school aged kids, and some continued singing with DYC through high school. Having the opportunity to work in this group has been rewarding for me also!

Through my work with the two youth groups as part of the Durango Choral Society, my interest in singing with the adult DCS choir was re-piqued (I sang with them for a while in 1986-7), and the timing was right to join that group. I have sung with the Choral Society since 2015. The happiness I have felt in working with these groups, being inspired by Amy Barrett and Linda Mack as well as other performers, is difficult to adequately express. I feel deeply fortunate and grateful for these opportunities.

I am originally from rural Santa Fe, New Mexico. I came to Durango to attend Fort Lewis College. I received a BA in English in 1979 and never really left the area. My husband and I have lived in Vallecito, CO for forty years. We raised three children, and have 7 grandchildren. Besides music, I enjoy watercolor painting, hiking, writing, reading, our animals, family, and lots of other stuff!
