A FELLOW MUSICIAN

Adam Swanson joined the DCS for our Christmas Concert at the Community Concert Hall and we are thrilled that he will be joining us again for our annual Cabaret at the Durango Arts Center on May 4. You do not want to miss this event! Although Adam needs no introduction to anyone who lives in Durango and loves music, here's a short bio of this hugely talented musician.



Adam Swanson is one of the world's foremost pianists and historians of vintage American popular music, including ragtime, early jazz, the Great American Songbook, and more. Adam has been a featured performer and lecturer at ragtime and jazz festivals across the United States and abroad, and he is the only four-time winner of the World Championship Old-Time Piano Playing Contest. He made his New York debut in Carnegie Hall at the age of nineteen, where he performed with Michael Feinstein. Adam appeared alongside pianist John Arpin at the Bohem Ragtime and Jazz Festival in the Republic of Hungary, and he has also toured Switzerland and Australia. Adam has accompanied silent films at the prestigious Cinecon Classic Film Festival in Hollywood and performed privately for Oscar-winning Disney/Hollywood composer Richard M. Sherman (*Mary Poppins*, etc.). At the age of twenty-one, Adam performed a solo concert at the Kennedy Center Millennium Stage in Washington, D.C.

Adam holds a bachelor's degree in classical piano and a master's in musicology from the Peabody Conservatory of Johns Hopkins University. He has been mentored by other ragtime artists including the famed Max Morath and legendary 1950s recording artist Johnny Maddox, who was one of Adam's greatest influences. Adam has recorded albums with noted musicians such as former rock star Ian Whitcomb, the Peacherine Ragtime Society Orchestra, and the Bar D Wranglers. Adam's recordings have been used on the CBC TV show *Murdoch Mysteries*. Listen to Adam's livestream virtual concerts on his Facebook page and YouTube channel. Viva Vivaldi



Did you know that Antonio Vivaldi was a red-haired priest? And that he ran an orphanage for young girls???

Vivaldi's crop of curly red hair, inherited from his father, prompted friends to nickname the composer 'il Prete Rosso'—the red priest. His father was just nicknamed 'Rossi'—redhead. Don't be fooled by the white hair in the picture—the composer was wearing a wig!



Our Director Emerita, Linda Mack Berven, is channeling Vivaldi in anticipation of conducting his beautiful *Gloria* in Florence, Italy in May, on a concert tour.

Linda was set for this trip to Florence in 2020, which had to be cancelled due to Covid.

Welcome back Linda! And hopefully good riddance to Covid.



Today Vivaldi is one of the most popular of all composers, who during his lifetime enjoyed considerable success and fortune, which he squandered through extravagance, and when he died in Vienna he was buried in a pauper's grave. For two centuries after his death, the *Gloria* lay undiscovered until the late 1920s, when it was found buried among a pile of forgotten Vivaldi manuscripts.

However, it was not performed until September 1939 in Siena in an edition by the composer Alfredo Casella. This was by no means an authentic edition (he described it as an 'elaborazione'), as he embellished the original orchestration of trumpet, oboe, strings, while reducing the role of the continuo, and cut sections from three movements. It was not until 1957 that the now familiar original version was published and given its first performance at the First Festival of Baroque Choral Music at Brooklyn College, NY.
